Solution:

1- Concept of Tour Operation:

The concept of tour operation refers to the process of planning, organizing, and managing travel services to create a complete and enjoyable travel experience for tourists. A tour operator acts as the manufacturer of tourism products by combining different travel components such as:

- -Transportation (flights, trains, buses, car rentals)
- -Accommodation (hotels, resorts, guesthouses)
- -Food and beverages (restaurants, meal plans)
- -Sightseeing and entertainment (guided tours, excursions, activities)

These components are combined into a single package tour sold at a fixed price, either directly to customers or through travel agencies.

Tour operations also include pricing, contracting with suppliers, marketing, risk management, and ensuring customer satisfaction throughout the travel experience.

In short, tour operation involves transforming separate travel services into a unified, well-organized, and value-added tourism product.

2. Organizational Structure of a Travel Agency / Tour Operation

Managing Director /	Overall management, planning, and coordination of all
General Manager	activities.
Operations Department	Designs itineraries, coordinates bookings, handles supplier
	contracts, and manages logistics.
Sales and Marketing	Promotes products, manages advertising, handles customer
Department	relations, and increases sales.
Ticketing / Reservation	Manages bookings for flights, trains, hotels, and car rentals.

Accounts and Finance	Controls budgeting, billing, payments to suppliers, and
Department	financial reporting.
Human Resources	Recruitment, staff training, and employee welfare.

Customer Service	Provides after-sales service, complaint handling, and
